



Award-winning photographer Bill Brett is joined by his daughter Kerry Brett for a new book *Boston, Inspirational Women*, a 166-page collection of portraits of an extraordinary range of Boston women from the famous to those who quietly make a difference in thousands of lives. It is believed to be the first father/daughter published photography collaboration.

The book also marks Bill Brett's fourth collaboration with veteran Boston journalist Carol Beggy, who wrote the text to accompany the father and daughter's distinctive portraits. The foreword is written by Hill Holliday President Karen Kaplan.

Like Bill Brett's first two books, *Boston, Inspirational Women* is entirely in black and white. It is being published by Three Bean Press, a women-owned publishing firm based in Boston's Jamaica Plain neighborhood.

The book features more than 125 women with Boston ties that make the city the vibrant and interesting place it is. Those featured includes the first female ironworker to ever "top out" a Boston high-rise and some of the most important philanthropic women in the country.
